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### **Convergence Council Member – Position Description**

The Open Security Exchange has established a group of Security professionals, considered “**thought leaders**” in the area of Security Convergence. That is, as a Security practitioner, they have demonstrated their expertise in converging the efforts of physical security with logical and information security within their own environment. This group of individuals, known as the Open Security Exchange Convergence Council (OSECC) will assist the OSE in developing valuable tools and information to deliver to the industry in an effort to accelerate the convergence of the two domains. The membership consists of individuals whose backgrounds and expertise originate from both domains.

This position is by invitation only and does not require a membership fee for 2009. The individual and the organization they represent, however can utilize the position to gain visibility in the market place as subject matter experts on the topic of security convergence.

The time resource requirement is a minimum of six (6) HPM (hours per month) and will be expended by participating on:

1. Committee conference calls / webinars to vet ideas and offer direction,
2. Speaking opportunities to share experiences, knowledge and gain visibility for the organization and our efforts,
3. Participation in writing and or reviewing White Papers and Standards proposals, and,
4. Occasionally participating in Board Meetings in an advisory role.

The group will be of optimal size when we have 15 to 20 active members; currently we are seeking the addition of seven (7) new members from the ASIS CSO Roundtable.

The members of this prestigious council assist the OSE in the following ways:

- Participates in quarterly workgroup briefing calls with the OSE Technical Committee;
- Participates in Case Study efforts as a subject or an evaluator of the case study prior to publication;
- Promotes awareness with other end-users directly or by agreeing to be a reference;
- Takes an active role in recommending white paper and discussion group topics;
- Provides the OSE with “voice of the customer” feedback on efforts and initiatives.
